## Questions you may be asked at an interview

Below are some questions which you may be asked during your interview. Again, these are indicative and should not be seen as a comprehensive list. They instead highlight areas you should consider ahead of any interview.

- 1. Why do you want to study in the UK?
- 2. What are the benefits of studying in the UK compared to any other country or your home country?
- 3. Why did you choose to study at this University?
- 4. How did you find out about this University?
- 5. Which other universities have you considered?
- 6. Where is this University and how will you travel there?
- 7. Have you arranged your accommodation yet in the UK? If not, how will you go about doing so?
- 8. What is the name of the course you will be studying at the University?
- 9. When does your course start and how long does it last?
- 10. How many modules will you be studying and what topics will be covered?
- 11. Why did you choose your course and which topics are you most interested in?
- 12. How does this course fit in with your previous studies / work experience?
- 13. Why have you chosen now to undertake this course?
- 14. How will your course be assessed?
- 15. What qualification will you receive?
- 16. What is the relevance of the course to your future career path and what do you plan to do at the end of your course?
- 17. Are any Dependants accompanying you to the UK and if so what will they do when in the UK?
- 18. How will you pay for your studies in the UK?
- 19. If your parents are funding your studies in the UK what occupations do they hold and how much is their salary?
- 20. Do you intend to work whilst in the UK and do you understand the work restrictions under the student visa route of the Points Based System (PBS)?
